### **DECISION OF THE MANAWATU DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE (ON THE PAPERS)**

This application was considered by the Commissioner of the Manawatu District Licensing Committee pursuant to section 191(2) of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.

#### **Application**

**THE FEILDING CLUB LIMITED** has applied for the issue of an off-licence in respect of premises situated at 25 Kimbolton Road, Feilding and known as The Feilding Club.

#### **Inquiring Agency Reports**

##### ***Police***

The New Zealand Police do not oppose the application.

##### ***Licensing Inspector***

A report from the Manawatu District Council Licensing Inspector dated 19<sup>th</sup> March 2026 was received and considered. The Inspector did not oppose the application.

##### ***Medical Officer of Health***

The Medical Officer of Health does not oppose the application.

#### **Local Alcohol Policy**

There is no local alcohol policy in force within the Manawatu district.

#### **Consideration of the application**

As no objection to the application has been filed and no matters of opposition have been raised by the inquiring agencies, the application was considered pursuant to section 191(2) of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 by the Commissioner of the District Licensing Committee sitting alone.

In considering whether to issue an off-licence, the licensing committee considered the criteria set out in section 105 of the Act.

#### **District Licensing Committee decision**

*Having regard to the information supporting the application and having regard to the criteria set out in section 105 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 the Manawatu District Licensing Committee grants the issue of an off- licence to The Feilding Club Limited in respect of premises situated at 25 Kimbolton Road, Feilding and known as The Feilding Club for a period of one year, subject to the following conditions:*

1. No alcohol may be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1 pm on Anzac Day to any person who is not on the premises to dine.
2. Alcohol may be sold and supplied for consumption on the premises, and may be consumed on the premises, during the following days and during the following hours:  
**Monday to Thursday**                      **9.00 a.m. to 12.00 midnight**  
**Friday to Saturday**                      **9.00 a.m. to 1.00 a.m. the following day**  
**Sunday**                                      **9.00 a.m. to 10.00 p.m.**
3. The area where alcohol is to be sold and consumed is described in the plan date stamped as received by the District Licensing Committee on 10 February 2023 and no alcohol is to be taken out of this area.
4. The entire premises are designated as a **supervised area**.
5. The holder of a manager's certificate or a properly notified manager shall be on duty and on the premises at all times alcohol is sold.
6. When no alcohol is being sold and no manager is present or on duty, the Club's alcohol must be secured from access.
7. A Host Responsibility Policy must be maintained and displayed at all points of sale and the Licensee must ensure all staff receive training in their responsibilities and obligations under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.
8. A "self-policing policy" must be formalised, maintained and adhered to at all times the premises are open for the consumption of alcohol only.
9. There must be no sale or supply of alcohol to minors or intoxicated persons and there must be displayed at every point of sale appropriate signs detailing these restrictions.
10. Drinking water must be freely available, and this must be clear to customers, while the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol.
11. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times when open for the sale of alcohol. A minimum of four types of food choices must be available (excluding nuts, chips and the like). Menus and the availability should be clear to customers and food should be actively promoted.
12. A range of low-alcohol and non-alcoholic drinks must be available at all times when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol.
13. The licensee must ensure that signs are prominently displayed within the licensed premises detailing information regarding alternative forms of transport from the premises.
14. A copy of the licence must be displayed at the principal entrances to the premises. The entrances from Warwick Street and Kimbolton Road are designated as the principal entrances.
