Council Update February 2025- Hiwinui

The first Council meeting for 2025 was on Wednesday 5 February. This was the last meeting to be held in the Council Chambers for a while. Council meetings will be held in the St John's building at 35 Bowen Street for a few months whilst the reroofing of MDC administration building takes place. The Council flag will be flown at the St John's building to indicate where to find the meetings. MDC Customer Service is now located at the Makino and there will be no entry to the MDC building via Manchester Street entrance from Friday 21 February.

Public communications regarding the reroofing project will be released shortly and will be able to be found from the MDC website homepage.

On the agenda last Wednesday, there was an Annual Plan update (page 20) and an application for the temporary closure of Pararorangi Road on Saturday 8 March for a Rally Sprint event (page 28) was approved.

Also, a decision was made to continue with the random placement of candidate names on voting papers for the 2025 Local Body Elections. The names will be in a different random order on each voting paper.

Consultation on the Development and Financial Contributions Policy is now closed. Regarding Local Water Done Well, Council voted to consult on three options:

- 1. In-house, stand-alone model (the status quo) Council's preferred option
- 2. A multi-council Water Services Council Controlled Organisation (CCO) jointly between MDC and PNCC.
- 3. A multi-council Water Services Council Controlled Organisation (CCO) jointly between MDC, PNCC, Horowhenua DC and Kapiti Coast DC.
