Council Update August 2025- Hiwinui

Council approved a request to close several roads in northern Manawatu so the Annual Targa Rally could be held on Saturday 18 October 2025. (For details see Council Agenda for 24 July 25 beginning on page 187).

Council approved the draft Memorandum of Arrangement between MDC and the Ministry of State Administration (on behalf of the Municipal Authority of Cova-Lima(Suai)), Timor Leste. This formalises a collaborative relationship focused on shared interests such as agriculture, education and workforce development. (The Memorandum of Arrangement can be viewed in the Council Agenda for 24 July 2025, from page 199). The official signing ceremony took place on 30 July 2025. There is a link to more details and photos from the day on the MDC Homepage.

The Manawatu Funding Forum is being held at the Community Hub on Wednesday 20 August 2025 from 3 – 7pm. This is a chance to connect face-to-face with a diverse group of funders.

The Creative Communities Scheme is a partnership in which Council administers funding on behalf of Creative New Zealand to support community-based arts activities within the Manawatū District. Some work on the District Plan Review has been stopped at the request of central government until RMA amendments are finalised.
