# 5. Rangiwahia Community Plan

Update not available yet. Remains a work in progress

#### 6. Community Donations / in-kind support

Steve Bielski reported that he accompanied retired surveyor Bruce Stern, current surveyor Stephen Oldfield (Central District Survey), and Alasdair Bettles-Hall to re-survey the existing public track leading up to the Rangiwahia Trig, which offers stunning panoramic views. Stephen Oldfield generously donated his time and expertise for this work, free of charge. The five-meter access begins at the lower end of the laneway next to the reserve. Local farmer Murray Curtis has been informed about the survey. To help mark the access route, Steve purchased steel standards and yellow caps at a cost of \$84.90. As the access runs alongside private land, dogs are not permitted. Mary has requested permission to purchase a "An Information including No Dogs Allowed" sign to be placed on the fence at the start of the track.

It was agreed that Fiona, as secretary, with Mary's assistance, will send a thank-you card or letter to Stephen Oldfield, along with a \$100 petrol voucher, in appreciation of his generous contribution to the project. Thank you letter and \$100 voucher to be provided for survey work undertaken by Stephen Oldfield.

Many thanks to Greg Clifton for organising the repaint of the little Karewarewa School house. Looks awesome. Much appreciated.

## 7. Rangiwahia Reserves

Steve Bielski provided an update regarding both reserves. All tracks in reserves (Scenic and Kaikawaka) cleared and in good walking condition. Generally pretty good for pests at the moment.

Steve Bielski is not standing in the 2025 elections. Shelley Dew-Hopkins advised that she would be running as a rural ward candidate.

## 13. Traffic/Police Report - Ben Flintoff

Ongoing concerns are speeding and safety near hall approaches. Discussed better placement/rotation of speed-feedback signage, and getting fresh traffic count data to evidence requests.

Crime activity is minimal at the moment.

Mental health issues are taking up most of his time currently.

Actions: Request an updated traffic count from MDC.
