Council approved a request to close several roads in northern Manawatu so the Annual Targa Rally could be held on Saturday 18 October 2025.

Council approved the draft Memorandum of Arrangement between MDC and the Ministry of State Administration (on behalf of the Municipal Authority of Cova-Lima(Suai)), Timor Leste. This formalises a collaborative relationship focused on shared interests such as agriculture, education and workforce development.
