Matters Arising	Processing Trees at school - Trev Hendra - (wants to put in planting between Cemeteries) suggests that when the tanks go in at the back of the school, use the dirt to bury the logs and shape as a natural landmark. Any koha/payment to committee members needs to be set up and approved by the "other two" our three bankers are Chris, Jen and Grant. *Bus shelter Storm Blue Matt (9155248M). *Ratification of paid invoice for Fauldings sound - Chris paid, seconded Grant, Del *Asked that Ohaea themed rubbish bins contacts be found (Pete Shaw). Parks and Reserves. To Use information for beautification of the village eg bin at bus shelter (Council to confirm that a village is allowed a min number of bins to be serviced - 9?). *Hall Men's urinals - replaced with modern individual models for ease of cleaning etc. Request Council/James come out and decide. Also LEDs and score board to be repaired (Jen to take to Auldspark) The electrician says it's on the waitlist but we will also inquire about replacing it. *Grant to buy paver and glue for Coronation Tree plaque - pre-approval granted, approximate cost: Paver 17-22 and glue approx \$10. Receipt to Chris, approved by Jen. New Community Funding ideas: Generator - SCC Obtain from Central Energy Trust. Civil Defense Community Response & recovery plan - Check with Council one is lodged and completed Helen check with Hannah, current Civil Defense Officer) the issue has been distribution - eg Tangimoana - download, go to a shop/school and get a physical copy. We could post on our Web Page, have copies available at the markets etc. Acknowledge Bryn - community champions - The Breeze.
General Business	Grayson - Nets out on the court encouraging kids to play and stay. Is there a possibility for the space to be upgraded into an all weather turf play space. To improve safety - fencing (MoE approval) converted into safety approved style all by end of year. Turfed area proposal - whole court approximately \$38K. Further, might need solar flood lights. Impacts/Threats to SCC - parking for Hall clients impacted for four major events and counting, concerns for safety afterhours and drawing folk into the immediate hall area - graffiti, damage/break-ins, spins in the car-park etc. Area will require a high cage type fence to prevent balls smashing Hall windows. History for school roll: last year 11, now 23 with new entrants. Historical account of school - confidential but if you know anyone who can connect the dots get them to get in touch with Grayson. Particularly booking for the old school bell which was used at the Scotts Ferry point.

	Hall money management - booking money can be used for repairs/maintenance but still needs consultation with James. Permanent chattels need to be applied for to be paid for by Council. Always check with James on ANYTHING to do with Hall. Otherwise SCC income is for community projects and improvements.

Council Reports	Planting initiative of Trevor Hendra's - Alison spoke to James, he will meet onsite and discuss - image of Council land boundary at Cemetery provided (and shared) - all on Council land so shouldn't be complicated at all because only one lease holder. Alison short:
	Mayor Helen has announced this week that she will not seek re-election in the upcoming local government elections in October. She has been mayor for nine years and with her previous role at Feilding Promotions has served our community for 30 years.
	Local Water Done Well. We received 505 written submissions. 96% of people agreed that MDC remaining a stand alone in-house 3 waters service provider was the best long-term option for our council. We have heard those submitters who wanted to speak and will adopt our final decision at the May 15th council meeting. *

Freedom Camping Bylaw review. We received 17 submissions for this. Some from individuals and some from organisations like NZMCA (New Zealand Motor Home Association). Many submitters asked questions and raised issues that need further investigation, so we have pushed out the date for deliberating and adopting this by a further month.

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Significance and Engagement policy review. This existing policy on how MDC engages with the community has had a significant update and has also been out for consultation. Submissions close this week.

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Homelessness. There has been a noticeable increase in people living in council parks or rough sleeping in our district, particularly Timona Park in Feilding. Council has regulatory officers who call in on these people and assess their situation. They always take a welfare approach and will link them to MSD or social services if needed. Sadly, this is on the increase all over New Zealand. Freedom camping or sleeping rough is not of itself a crime. This is a social problem largely driven by the high cost of living. With winter coming many churches and social services are increasing their support in this space. If you have concerns about someone living in a public park, please contact council.
