We have passed, but there were several strong recommendations.</li> <li>3. Overall: Old handles are prone to fail and key holes aren't allowed. Lever handles are the preferred option. Any lock system needs to be mid height for easy access.</li> <li>4. ACTIONS needed: replace handle on Women's toilet</li> <li>5. Front door key hole needs puttying, so can't be used.</li> <li>6. Kitchen outside door needs plate exit system (like the double doors already has) ...as low bolt is unsuitable in fire.</li> <li>7. High bolt on small doors from porch, needs moving to be at mid height.</li> <li>8. Sensor (maybe) needed on emergency light signs. Drain from school is complete, council need to do their part, which was promised. <i>This is for the Pipe under the road from the end of the open cut drain completed by the School.</i></li> <li>3. Will there be budget for more green waste fence in next round?? – NO BUDGET IN 2025 / 2026 year</li> <li>4. Scotts Ferry Road Justin raised the issue that no new gravel has been placed for many years, Cr Alison gave the details of the contractor for Justin to contact. – No Update</li> <li>5. Roothing issue within the Village with the Open road speeds again highlighted as inappropriate, this issue has been raised multiple times to council over the past 3 years with the same response – NZTA own the road speed and would be too difficult to change, other discussion around the behaviours of the road users not changing even if the speed limit was lowered were expressed and they believed that they would probably not.</li> <li>8. Further Roothing issue highlighted with a member of the community placing concrete posts on the edge of the road and footpath on the corner of Moana / Beach Street, To be reported to the council via the App – Suggested that someone visit the residents likely to have installed to forewarn them of pending report of issue.</li> <li>9. Recent posts of Facebook page regarding the Deer issues, One Vehicle damaged when hitting deer in the cutting, One reported sighting of deer along the straight with photos showing how far the deer roam along Tangimoana road – not just the cutting and village side of the cutting, tabled ideas to ask that he trees not be planted so close to the road to create better vision or install deer fencing to minimise the areas that deer cross, this idea dismissed and suggested that residents should take personal responsibility</li> </ol>	<b>Actions:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. 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## Alison's report:- July

- Council elections. Nominations for council close on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> August. If anyone is interested in standing for council, I am happy to meet over a coffee and share with them what the role involves. (027) 429 4560
- Community Honours. Nominations close 31<sup>st</sup> July. Details on MDC website.
- The "Waste Not, Want Not" waste reduction grant scheme closes the 27<sup>th</sup> July. This funds groups or organisations to put in place programmes to reduce waste to landfill in the Manawatu District. Eg The Repair Café - fix it don't bin it mornings, run by volunteers.
- The new reservoir and water treatment for the Stanway Halcombe Rural Water Scheme is now operational. The scheme intake suffered severe damage during Cyclone Gabrielle as the Rangitikei River experienced very high flows. Cyclone recovery funding was used.
- Churchill Drive and Makiekie bridges, both near Totara Reserve in the Pohangina Valley are well underway with their replacements. They too were washed out with Cyclone Gabrielle 3 years ago and also received government cyclone recovery funding of 75%.
- Freedom camping bylaw. This was adopted and has changed to allow non-self contained vehicles to park at the new playground car park (limit 2) and at West Square (limit 3). No roadside freedom camping in Tangimoana village as the streets aren't suitable. Plus we do want to encourage people to stay in the motor camp.
