Council report: Cr Alison Short

- MDC received over 250 written submissions to its long term plan.
- Many submitted spoke to the council over three days.
- The council had consulted on four main topics roading differential adjustment, closing the bird aviaries in Kowhai Park, Feilding; how to fund Feilding CBD parking enforcement and some adjustments to fees & charges.
- Individuals and organisations also spoke to us about other topics. A strong iwi/Māori voice asked MDC to oppose the disestablishment of Māori Wards, funding or support for community projects like walkways / cycleways, investigating solar panels on council buildings, support for waste reduction initiatives etc.

General Business:

1. DRAFT Tangimoana Civil Defence Community response plan. Jennifer and Justin had been working on this and had met with Nick & Hannah from MDC Civil Defence. Issues identified were – does Tangimoana require a generator and should it be fixed or mobile? It was thought the school no longer has a working Civil Defence VHF Radio, Jennifer would contact Principal Trudi and work this through.

2. Hall power supply issues were highlighted at the recent stallholder's market. Ken would investigate solutions. Maybe a plug on the switchboard that could run a lead outside.
3. Road signs. One of the deer warning signs had been taken again by the cutting. This is frustrating. Are there any other options like a painted warning on the road. Several signs have been taken in the past twelve months. There have been a number of car vs deer incidents lately, so some form of signage is definitely required.
4. Hall water. There hasn't been much rain lately and the hall tank ran dry. Two truckloads of water were purchased.
5. The old film projector that was hanging from the hall ceiling has been taken down. Justin would look into how to dispose of it noting that there is a large item rubbish collection on June 1<sup>st</sup> in the village.
6. Greenwaste fence. Getting worse. Urgent replacement needed. Take more photos to send in.
7. Scotts Ferry Rd. Gravel and base in very poor repair. Has it been overlooked on the maintenance schedule? Needs a grader or digger to tidy it up for winter. A road that is used a lot for access to recreation.
8. Tangimoana Beach Rd sand clearance. Earlier in the year we requested an increased level of service. Has this been approved.
9. Chorus plinth at rear of hall. This has been driven into, which is no surprise considering where its located. Hilary will follow up with Chorus.
