Finalise and adopt the Water Services Delivery Plan	Completed	Yes	The Manawātū District Council Water Services Delivery Plan was approved by the Department of Internal Affairs on 12 November 2025.
Obtain Feilding Integrated Abstraction consent	Completed	Yes	The Feilding Integrated Abstraction Consent Decision (APP-2002010024.01), for a resource consent to take a combined total volume of 27,813 cubic metres per day comprising surface water from the Ōroua River at Barrows Road, groundwater from Bore 326117 at Campbell Road, groundwater from Bore 326113 at Newbury Line, and groundwater from Bore 325403 at Roots Street, Feilding, to supply the Feilding township, was approved on 20 October 2025. The expiry date for this consent is 1 July 2059.
Begin Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition) SCADA upgrades	Ongoing	Yes	Initial work to progress SCADA upgrades is underway. The programme will require continued coordination between operational, compliance, information technology, and supplier resources to support consistent data capture, alarm management, and reporting.
Standardise water, wastewater, and stormwater standard operating procedures	Completed	Yes	Standard operating procedures for water, wastewater, and stormwater activities have been completed. Ongoing review will be required as operational practices, assets, and regulatory requirements change
Asset condition assessment (stormwater focus)	Ongoing	Yes	Stormwater asset condition assessment work has commenced to improve the quality of condition data and support prioritisation of renewals and capital investment. The principal risk is incomplete or inconsistent asset information; this will be managed through staged data validation and targeted inspections.

Begin preparatory financial ringfencing work	In progress	Yes	Preparatory work for financial ringfencing has commenced. This includes progressing the financial structures, coding, and reporting approaches needed to support separation of water services finances from other Council activities in advance of the 1 July 2027 requirement.
Drinking Water Safety Plan	Complete	Yes	The Drinking Water Safety Plan has been updated to include the completed work at the Campbell Road bore plant. It has also been updated to ensure alignment with current regulatory obligations and Taumata Arowai requirements.

Prepare the draft Water Services Strategy	Work has commenced on Manawatū Waters Services Strategy to identify the strategic matters, service priorities, and future investment requirements to be addressed.
Prepare the draft Strategic Asset Management Plan and Asset Management Plan	Work has commenced on the Manawatū Waters Services Strategic Asset Management Plan and Asset Management Plan with a focus on asset condition, levels of service, risk, renewals, and the capital programme.
Prepare the draft Trade Waste Bylaw and Discharge Plan	Continue drafting and internal review of the Trade Waste Bylaw and Discharge Plan to support consistent management, monitoring, and enforcement of trade waste discharges.
Establish a pipe renewal prioritisation program	We have established a plan focussing on prioritisation, informed by asset condition information, network criticality and information provided by our reticulation teams. This work will support a more targeted and evidence-based approach to renewals planning and future investment decisions.
Progress Halcombe Wastewater Centralisation	Stage 1 pipework installation between Mt Stewart and Mt Biggs school is completed and looking to award the final stage of the pipe in August between the school and Halcombe township.
Continue financial ringfencing preparation	Further develop the financial structure, coding, reporting, and internal processes required to achieve water services financial separation by 1 July 2027.
