The Final!

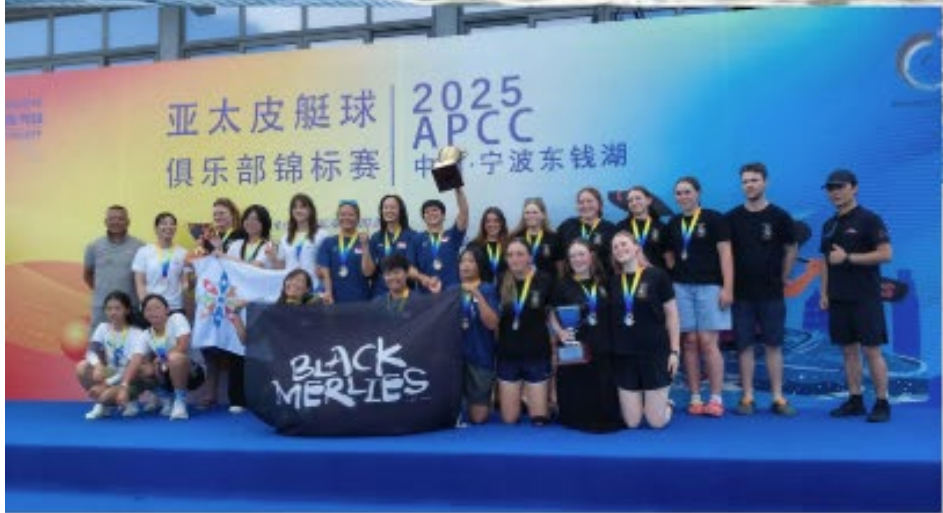
The final for the Silver medal was a tough battle against the Singapore Women's team. We played through challenging heats, with temperatures often reaching around 35 degrees.
