Kia ora tātou

Thank you for circulating the minutes

My colleagues and I completed a site visit on 19 June 2024 after receiving the Permit. We will be undertaking a follow up visit to the pumpstation end in early July to get a better understanding of how the pumpstation works.

I would like to amend the MDC section of the minutes if possible to the following:

Robert Rose works for Manawatū District Council as a Senior Environmental Advisor. As a representative of the Council (Concession Holder), he has been asked to review the Pukepuke Lagoon drainage concession requirements and detail the required actions that are to be taken to fulfil the monitoring and reporting requirements of the Pukepuke Puke Lagoon drainage Concession. While Robert will be overseeing some of this work Council will be responsible for fulfilling the concession requirements.

Robert Rose prepared the Manawatū District Council monitoring programme summary to provide an overview of the Concession requirements. This overview was submitted to the DoC and subsequently circulated to the wider group. Details around how each part of the concession requirements will be worked out through the development of the Concession Management Plan and further engagement with iwi and DoC. It is acknowledged that Ngāti Apa need to be added to this monitoring programme summary, specifically in relation to the Eel surveys and Robert apologised for this oversight.

Robert confirmed that the Concession Management Plan will reference the Natural Heritage Plan for Pukepuke Lagoon, Manawatu. However, the Concession Management Plan will not be finalised until the joint site visit occurs.

Robert would like to start with a clean slate. He acknowledges that engagement with Ngāti Apa and Rangitāne o Manawatū is essential.

Robert indicated that he needed to complete a site visit to get a better understanding of a potential monitoring programme and water monitoring.

Robert is keen to get a better understanding of what the cultural monitoring might look like as it is currently not specified in the concession.

Robert acknowledged that the monitoring requirements and reporting of the concession have not been fulfilled. The Manawatū District Council Pukepuke Lagoon concession Management Plan intends to address this (although this is required as per the concession).

The Oroua Drainage Board was responsible for managing the drainage of the area, it has been set up as a water reticulation system. However, MDC has held the permit since early 2000's which is where the liability lies.

Robert is looking at going on a site visit next week (week of 17th June).

I don't believe these proposed changes are significantly different from the draft minutes that were circulated. However, I think the changes are important as it better reflects my role and Councils commitment to engage with Ngāti Apa and Rangitāne o Manawatū in relation to the required concession monitoring.

I look forward to the joint site visit once a date is finalised.
